To Dillion, it was a trip of a lifetime.

"We went to batting practice first, and he was so excited," said Dillion Papier's mom, Darrile. "Brian Roberts came over and talked with him and was really sweet with him. Some players feel uncomfortable talking with kids they don't know, but he was wonderful."

By the end of the first day, Darrile Papier said Dillion knew everyone in the park. "He knew the staff, the guys doing the score boards, the people working at the concessions — he just walks up to people and introduces himself," she said.

Dillion had his heart set on meeting the umpires, for whom he has a special affection. So when he was invited to meet at the mound before the first of two games he attended and walk away with the team's starting line-up paperwork, he was all smiles.

The starting line-up document is among the plethora of things Dillion brought back

Back home again, Dillion is gearing up for baseball season and has been attending practices with dad Mark Papier, who coaches baseball at Thomas Johnson High School.
